


"EU wants to reduce dependency

Initial situation today



EU action so far to tackle the energy crisis



With the energy price instruments, Member States have taken numerous measures at national level to reduce price pressure on households and industry.



The REPowerEU plan aims to end dependence on fossil energy from Russia as soon as possible.



To ensure security of supply for the coming winters, there are new minimum gas storage commitments and a 15% gas demand reduction target.



In September 2022, new measures were adopted to reduce electricity consumption and pass on surpluses to households and industry.



On 18th October 2022, the EC proposed further measures on joint gas procurement, price cap mechanisms and transparent use of infrastructure, solidarity between Member States and demand-side management.



Russian gas supplies reduced from 40% to around 9%

5% Mandatory electricity reduction in peak times 15%
Gas demand reduction target

92% Level of gas storage in the EU



Supporting households and businesses: Recent examples



EU state aid rules to allow national programmes to rescue companies due to high energy prices (e.g. €200 billion in Germany for gas and electricity prices).



Approval of a Polish scheme to partially compensate energy-intensive companies for higher electricity prices caused by indirect emission costs through EU state aid rules.



EC approval of a Spanish aid measure of over EUR 220 million for Cobra Instalaciones y Servicios, S.A. for the production of renewable hydrogen to meet the objectives of the EU Hydrogen Strategy, the European Green Deal and REPowerEU.



EC approval of €150 million of EU state aid rules to ensure security of electricity supply in Finland to achieve the European Green Deal and REPowerEU targets.



- Supplement to the Reconstruction and Crisis Management Facility (RRF)

Green Transition

- At least 37% of RRF funds for green technologies
- Sustainable mobility, energy efficiency, renewable energies, climate change, circular economy and biodiversity


Digital Transition

- Network expansion, public services, government processes, business, digital skills development, research and development

Enlargement

- Accession negotiations with Montenegro, Serbia
- Albania and Northern Macedonia as further candidate countries
- Bosnia, Herzegovina, Kosovo as potential candidate countries
- Ukraine as an open question
